

# BECOMING BULLETPROOF

Pittsburgh Premiere Director: Michael Barnett 2014, USA, 82 minutes

Follow a diverse community of artists from Zeno Mountain Farm who come together year after year to make a Hollywood movie, find friendship and grow as actors and individuals, regardless of their ability. This refreshingly genuine and endearing film-within-a-film reveals a dynamic, inclusive world that transcends stigmas and challenges stereotypes, while raising important questions about the lack of artistic opportunities for people with disabilities.

Pittsburgh Premiere Director: Jordan Melograna 2016, USA, 60 minutes English

Since the Fair Labor Standards
Act passed in 1938, American
workers have been free from labor
exploitation, with one exception:
people with disabilities. In 2016,
nearly 250,000 people with
disabilities continue to earn less than
the minimum wage. Through personal
stories and poignant interviews, this
eye-opening documentary exposes
this practice while presenting new
employment alternatives with
competitive wages and community
inclusion for workers of all abilities.

After a chance encounter with a fiery female activist, she begins to explore this uncharted world and its liberal sexualities. Based on the true story of a young Punjabi woman, Margarita with a Straw is a unique coming-ofage story about love, identity, and sexuality. (Appropriate for ages 16+)

#### **Pittsburgh Premieres**

Seven short films totaling 70 minutes highlight diverse themes across the ability spectrum.

**AUTISM IN LOVE** (USA, 9 minutes) A man with autism and his wife discuss their unconditional love.

I DON'T CARE (UK, 14 minutes)
A mother-to-be faces the possibility of having a child with Down syndrome.

MACROPOLIS (UK, 7 minutes) Two toys made at a factory are thrown out and together attempt to be put back on a store shelf.

MIDFIELD (Portugal, 6 minutes) An ordinary workday in the life of a dock worker — but when Sunday comes, an altogether different man emerges.

**PERFECT** (Canada, 12 minutes) Julius meets with his psychologist after what he considers to be a disastrous first date.

**STRINGS** (Spain, 11 minutes) Maria's routine at school is changed by the arrival of a new student who soon becomes her best friend.

WELCOME TO THE LAST BOOKSTORE (USA, 11 minutes) The story of a beloved bookstore owner—a father, husband, and paraplegic.

# THANK YOU FOR YOUR SERVICE

Pittsburgh Premiere Director: Tom Donahue 2015, USA, 88 minutes

English

The U.S. military faces an unprecedented mental health crisis as veterans returning to civilian life find themselves unequipped to manage the post-traumatic stress and depression that is leading to veteran suicides at an alarming rate. With candid interviews including those from Defense Secretary Robert Gates and General David Petraeus, the film reveals how current policies of the U.S. military are falling short of the critical mental health needs of our veterans.

"Unlike in most docs that fall into unabashed advocacy, Donahue's footage — wrenching testimonials from soldiers, spouses, and the highest of government and military muckety-mucks — tells gripping stories rather than just serving the argument. The argument, though, is persuasive: It's deeply immoral to train citizens for war but then not train them again, afterwards, for living." — Alan Scherstuhl, *The Village Voice*


